

Organizational Regulations of the Center for Studies of History-Informed International Relations, Department  
of Political Science, National Taiwan University

Approved by the Third Department Affairs Meeting of the spring semester of the 2022–2023 academic year on March 14, 2023

- Article 1      The Center for Studies of History-Informed International Relations (“the Center”) is established according to the resolution of the Third Department Affairs Meeting of the Department of Political Science, National Taiwan University of the spring semester of the 2022–2023 academic year.
- Article 2      The Center aims to promote theory, methods, case studies, policy research, and publication in the fields of history and international relations.
- Article 3      The responsibilities of the Center are as follows:
1. Organizing and participating in academic conferences, workshops, and symposiums.
  2. Promoting exchanges, visits, and cooperation with domestic and international universities and academic institutions.
  3. Accepting commissions from both within and outside the University to participate in or carry out research projects.
  4. Planning the creation and integration of relevant courses within and outside the University.
  5. Publishing and presenting research findings, and managing and maintaining the Center’s website and data.
- Article 4      The Center has one Director who is responsible for managing and planning the affairs of the Center. The Center Director is nominated by the Department Chair and appointed with the consent of the Department Affairs Meeting, with a term of two years, and may be reappointed.
- Article 5      The Center establishes a Committee to review its activities. The Committee consists of between three and five members, nominated by the Director from among the full-time faculty members of the Department and appointed after obtaining the approval of the Department Chair. The Committee members serve for a term of two years, and their appointment is reported to the Department Affairs Meeting for record.
- Article 6      Meetings of the Committee are convened by the Center Director. At least one meeting is held each semester to review the work plan and income and expenditure of the Center.
- The Director may convene a special meeting when he or she deems it necessary.
- Article 7      The Center has one Executive Director and may have one to two secretaries. Appointments and dismissals are made by the Center Director to assist in handling various tasks.
- The Executive Director may also serve as a member of the Committee.
- Article 8      All activities of the Center are carried out collaboratively by the faculty of the Department participating in the Center, and research groups may be established as necessary to jointly promote the activities.

- Article 9        The Center may invite scholars and experts from within and outside the University to serve as researchers, and senior scholars and experts from within and outside the University to serve as advisory committee members. Appointments and dismissals are made by the Center Director and reported to the Department for record.
- Article 10       The Center may submit a work report to the Department Affairs Meeting for consultation before the end of each academic year.
- Article 11       These Regulations take effect from the date of promulgation after being approved by the Department Affairs Meeting and are reported to the College for record.
