- Article 1 The Taiwan Security Research Center ("the Center") is established according to the resolution of the Third Department Affairs Meeting of the Department of Political Science, National Taiwan University of the fall semester of the 2001–2022 academic year, held on January 18,
- Article 2 2002.

The purpose of the Center is to enhance academic and policy research on Taiwan's security

- Article 3 and strengthen interaction with academia and think tanks both domestically and internationally.

  The responsibilities of the Center are as follows:
  - 1. Assisting in the development of the Taiwan Security Research website.
  - 2. Strengthening academic and policy research related to Taiwan's security and cross-Strait relations.
  - 3. Promoting research and dialogue on Taiwan's security issues with domestic and international academic institutions and think tanks.

The Center has one Director who is responsible for the affairs of the Center. The Director is nominated by the Department Chair and appointed with the consent of the Department Affairs

Article 5 Meeting, with a term of two years, and may be reappointed.

The Center has a Committee to review its activities. The Committee consists of between five and seven members who are jointly nominated by the Department Chair and the Center Director and appointed after obtaining the approval of the Department Affairs Meeting. The

Article 6 Committee includes at least one faculty member from each division of the Department.

Meetings of the Committee are convened by the Center Director. At least one meeting is held each semester, and special meetings may be convened when necessary.

Matters to be reviewed by the Center's Committee are as follows:

- 1. Annual plans.
- 2. Annual budget.
- 3. Academic cooperation and exchange.
- Article 8 4. Other related matters.

All activities of the Center are carried out collaboratively by the faculty of the Department participating in the Center, and research groups may be established as necessary to promote

Article 9 the activities.

The Center may have one Executive Director, who is appointed by the Center Director to assist

Article 10 in handling the affairs of the Center.

The Center may invite scholars and experts to serve as advisory committee members, and their

appointment is reported by the Director of the Center to the Department Affairs Meeting for record. Advisory committee members serve for a term of one year.

The Center's operations and financial overview shall be reported to the Department Affairs Meeting before the end of each academic year.

The Center is subject to a comprehensive review of its operations conducted by the Article 13

Department.

These Regulations take effect from the date of promulgation after being approved by the Department Affairs Meeting and are reported to the College for record.
