Regulations for the Establishment of the Cross-Strait and Regional Integration Center, Department of Political Science, College of Social Sciences, National Taiwan University

Article 1 According to the resolution of the Third Department Affairs Meeting of the Department of Political Science, National Taiwan University of the fall semester of the 2009–2010 academic year, held on January 5, 2010, the European Studies Center has been renamed as the Cross-Strait and Regional Integration Center ("the Center").

- Article 2 The purpose of the Center is to enhance academic research and teaching as well as policy research related to cross-Strait and regional integration, and to strengthen interaction with academia and think tanks both domestically and internationally.
- Article 3 The responsibilities of the Center are as follows:
 1. Exploring and promoting teaching and policy research related to cross-Strait and regional integration.

2. Strengthening joint research and dialogue on integration issues with domestic and international academic institutions and think tanks.

3. Promoting public understanding of cross-Strait and regional integration.

4. Accepting commissioned research projects and education and training programs from within and outside the University.

5. Promoting the integration of related programs within the University.

- Article 4 The Center has one Director who is responsible for the affairs of the Center. The Director is nominated by the Department Chair and appointed with the consent of the Department Affairs Meeting, with a term of two years, and may be reappointed.
- Article 5 The Center establishes a Committee to review its activities. The Committee consists of between five and seven members who are jointly nominated by the Department Chair and Center Director and appointed after obtaining the approval of the Department Affairs Meeting. The Committee include at least one faculty member from each division of the Department.
- Article 6 Meetings of the Committee are convened by the Center Director. At least one meeting is held each semester, and special meetings may be convened when necessary.

Article 7 Matters to be reviewed by the Center's Committee are as follows:

- 1. Annual plans.
- 2. Annual budget.
- 3. Academic cooperation and exchange.

4. Other related matters.

- Article 8 All activities of the Center are carried out collaboratively by the faculty of the Department participating in the Center, and research groups may be established as necessary to promote the activities.
- Article 9 The Center may have one Executive Director, who is appointed by the Center Director to assist in handling the affairs of the Center.
- Article 10 The Center may invite scholars and experts to serve as review committee members, and their appointment is reported by the Director of the Center to the Department Affairs Meeting for the record. Review committee members serve for a term of one year.
- Article 11The Center's operations and financial overview shall be reported to the Department AffairsMeeting before the end of each academic year.
- Article 12 The Center is subject to a comprehensive review of its operations conducted by the Department.
- Article 13These Regulations take effect from the date of promulgation after being approved by the
Department Affairs Meeting and are reported to the College for the record.
